# How to operate the Washer and Dryer (located upstairs)

- 1. Please use the liquid detergent provided. Fill far left slot of detergent tray and fill 1/2 full for large loads.
- 2. The instructions on the washer and dryer are friendly and intuitive, so the rest should be easy—if you can remember to clean the lint dryer between cycles, that would be appreciated.
- 3. The washing machine is sensitive to being over-loaded. Please take this into consideration when using.

# **Appliance Notes:**

- 1. **Stainless Steel Appliances:** if any of the stainless steel appliances require wiping, please use only soap, water, and microfibre cloths (located under oven).
- 2. Glass Stovetop: cleaner for the glass stovetop is in cupboard above the stove.

## Just in Case:

- 1. In summer, if you require additional fans, please let us know and we will bring them over.
- 2. Fire extinguisher is located under the kitchen sink.
- 3. First Aid Kit is located in the medicine cabinet in the downstairs bathroom.
- 4. This is an old house, so please be gentle with the toilet paper consumption, and please do not flush any feminine hygiene products or wipes (even if they say "flushable").

# Recycling/City Collection Day

- 1. **Tuesday mornings** are City Collection days, and Megan drops by Monday evenings to bring the recycling and garbage bins behind the house to the curb (Megan does not come into the house).
- 2. **In the House: Recycle bins** (plastic, metal, glass/cardboard/soft plastic) are located in the back porch. If they get filled, you can put each category in a blue plastic bag (bags are located below oven) and set them inside the grey bin behind the house.
- 3. **In the House: A compost** bin is located under the sink (if this becomes full, you can place contents into the green bin behind house).
- 4. **In the House: A Waste Bin** is located in the kitchen. If this gets full, you can put the plastic bag in the grey bin behind house. More clear plastic bags are located under stove.



### WHAT'S IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD?

A lot! You are in the heart of Halifax's North End where many of the city's best restaurants, breweries and gift shops reside. If you leave the house, turn right (northeast) on Livingstone, then right onto Agricola and keep walking, you can't miss them. When you reach Young Street, if you turn left you will find yourself in the Hydrostone—pizza, sushi, the Ostrich Club! If you turn left (southwest) upon leaving the house, you will reach Robie Street where great eateries also reside. The Atlantic Superstore on Young Street, just a short walk away, is a good place to buy groceries and things like wine.
